Change in Family Needs

Finishing your basement is the least expensive way to give you more living space.

Who should do it?

Do you have a family that is outgrowing your cramped home? Do you need a place to get away from it all? Do you now work from home and need a new office? Or maybe a play room for your kids to hangout in. You've decided that you need to do *something* sooner rather than later.

recommended to break the project up into increments. You don't have to finish everything at once **#3** Real estate agents recommend that you leave 30-50% of your basement unfinished for storage.


Water Can Totally Destroy Your Basement

BEWARE!! There are problems you can see and problems you can't.

- **Groundwater Leaks** These are obvious. This is water you see that comes through cracks in your wall and floors. These need fixed before any basement finishing.
- Wicking Occurs when water soaks through porous material like concrete and concrete blocks. Capillary action drives water from wet to dry.
- Vapor Transmission Vapor pressure drives water vapor from areas of high humidity to areas of low humidity. The ground around your home is close to 100% humidity all the time, causing water vapor to move through the concrete walls into your basement. Porous, organic materials adjacent to the walls absorbs this moisture, building to a level where mold can grow.
- Internal Sources of Water Vapor Daily life puts moisture in the air which gets absorbed by the materials in your basement. Clothes drying, showers, and even people put excess moisture into the air that get absorbed by organic materials.
- **Condensation** Even if you can't see it, condensation develops when warm, humid summer air enters your basement and is cooled on the basement walls and floor surfaces. The hotter and more humid the air, the more of a problem condensation will be.

Plumbing Leaks -

When a plumbing leak happens anywhere in your home, it always ends up in the basement. If you don't see it right away and you have used the wrong materials in your basement, you'll have a real expensive problem.



What Products Shouldn't I Use in My Basement?

You don't want grandpa's old musty basement. When considering basement finishing, the products that come to mind are traditional organic materials like drywall, wooden 2x4s and fiberboard ceiling panels. However, there is a problem...

The dangers of organic materials lurking in your basement

- Wood, drywall, most carpeting, fiberboard ceiling panels, paint, laminated flooring, and even fiberglass can be a home for mold to grow. They will absorb and hold moisture causing them to rot. Additionally, bugs feed on wet, organic materials.
- Finishing your space with these materials will lead you to continuously replace products every time your basement gets wet or absorbs moisture in the future.



Hazards of mold

Common side effects of household mold, as reported by Medline Plus, include: coughing, respiratory difficulties, hives, itching, rash, runny nose, sneezing, watering eyes, sinus pressure and wheezing. Mold can also cause musty odors, allergies, infections and asthma.

Your family's health is important, protect it with the right materials!

Some molds have toxic effects and can also trigger issues such as memory problems and brain damage, even if you are healthy, according to the Allergy Escape website. This type of mold is common in water- damaged homes that are not repaired properly.
